

Lewis and Clark - Research and ABC's Booklet

This researched based project will be completed in class. We will be using multiple sources to gather information about Lewis and Clark's journey exploring the newly gained Louisiana Territory.

Step 1: While reading books, researching websites, and watching videos, use the ABC graphic organizer chart to write down key terms relevant to their travel. Each letter should have AT LEAST 3 example words. Sample research site: <http://www.pbs.org/lewisandclark/inside/index.html>

Step 2: Complete the timeline detailing major events of the journey from start to finish. Must have AT LEAST 10 dates and events listed.

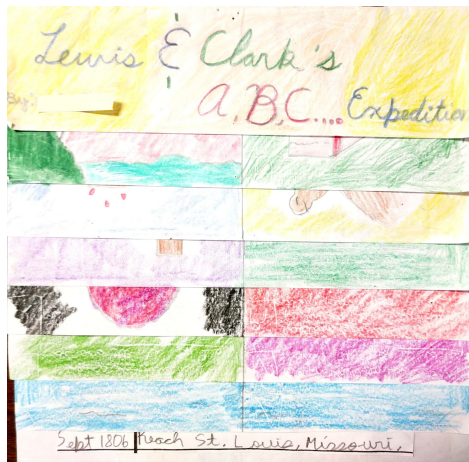
Step 3: Highlight the route they traveled on the map.

Step 4: Create the ABC flip book by overlaying 4 pieces of white paper leaving a half inch space between the bottom edge of each sheet and then folding it over. Once the booklet is assembled:

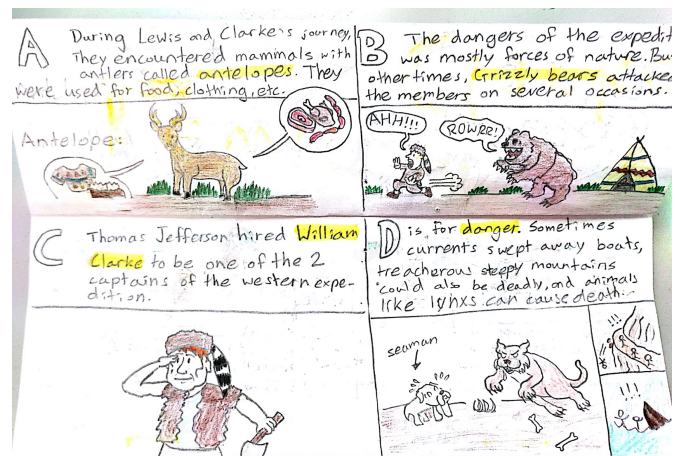
1. Flip book should have a neatly drawn/written title
2. Choose 1 word from the ABC graphic organizer for each letter of the alphabet to use for booklet.
3. Each page of booklet should be divided in half (using ruler). You will need to use the backs of pages as well.
4. For each letter, there should be: a word, illustration and a 1-2 sentence description explaining the significance to the Lewis and Clark expedition.

****Sentences should be fully developed, relevant, and written with proper sentence structure.**
